Do you have a clear vision that guides your charitable giving? A mission statement can help you focus on the specific causes you are looking to support, define your philanthropy goals and clarify your giving style. Reflect upon the <u>values</u>, <u>causes and interests</u> that are most important to you, and use that information to consider your broad goal(s) for your philanthropy.

Carefully consider the questions below.

- What kind of change are you hoping to make in the world through your charitable giving?
- How does this relate to your interests and values?
- ❖ How will you help bring about this change? Consider the following:

<u>Location</u> – community, regional, national or global <u>Population</u> – Jewish, general population, or both <u>Impact</u> -Support large organizations or small grass roots groups <u>Risk</u> – well known, established organizations or new, innovative organizations that don't have a track record

Example: I, Sarah Schwartz, believe that every child should have an opportunity to learn to read because this is central to one's ability to be self-sufficient and succeed in life. Because of my love of literature (interest), commitment to education (top issue area), tzedakah and equality (top values), I will support organizations that focus on literacy in my community and in Israel (location and population).
