Thus far, GCNY has collected over 6,500 pieces of sports equipment and has donated the equipment to over 20 partner organizations around the world, benefiting thousands of children.

In addition to GCNY, Sara is the captain of her school tennis and softball teams, editor for the school magazine, and President of the Human Rights Advocates club. She served as a member of the UJA of New York's Center for Youth Philanthropy and Leadership, and as a Youth Ambassador Council member for the Jewish Teen Funders Network. Sara is the recipient of the Diller Teen Tikkun Olam Award, Light of the Future Award, the Prudential Spirit of Community Award, the President's Volunteer Service Award, and the Good Deeds Award for LI Teens.

Sara seeks to inspire other teens to perform acts of tikkun olam, and to take action in their communities around the world.
